# Wireless access for Farfisa's intercoms

The Italian intercom manufacturer Farfisa is marketing a Bluetooth module for the Alba and Hero door stations, which allows doors to be opened wirelessly.

The 'XE2922 bus expansion card', as the module is called in full, was developed as a solution to the coronavirus. *“Instead of having to enter a pin code on the door station,”* explains marketing manager Giovanna Fangi, *“you can now type the code directly into your smartphone. This reduces the risk of corona contamination.”*

If the intercom already recognises your phone – and if you have permission from the owner of the intercom – it works even easier, according to Fangi. *“If this is the case, all you have to do is open the Farfisa app and press a button on your screen.”*

We worked hard on getting the app just right, especially in terms of user-friendliness.” The XE2922 module can be plugged into all Hero and Alba door stations. Farfisa's app is available for iOS and Android. ■
