

Hero: new vandal-proof intercom from Farfisa

The Italian intercom manufacturer Farfisa has launched a new Intercom. The Hero is vandal-resistant and can handle a large number of indoor stations.

The new intercom is made of stainless steel and is fully built-in. In addition, the buttons, display and camera are very flat. The cover plate is secured with 6 small Torx bolts, which also have a flat head. *“All of this makes the Hero extremely robust and vandal-resistant,”* says marketing manager Giovanna Fangi.

The intercom has been developed for Farfisa’s Duo video intercom system. It can be used as a mains unit for installations up to 20,000 indoor stations. The Hero is also equipped with a wide-angle camera, 14 illuminated buttons with numbers in Braille and an illuminated display. It is developed to handle various card readers. If you connect it to the Farfisa’s XE922 print, you can control it wirelessly with an app on your phone. ■



Oxygen relocates to larger premises

The Italian company Oxygen Automation from Bologna relocated to larger premises at the end of last year. The new building offers more space for stock storage and additional – and more spacious – workplaces. *“The R&D, marketing, export and quality control departments now all have their own area,”* says E-Commerce Manager Davide Rossi. *“At the previous location, we were all a bit cramped together.”*



Oxygen is a relatively new provider of gate drives. The company was founded in 2015.

While they don’t produce in-house, they do have an in-house research and development department. *“We distinguish ourselves by offering premium-quality products at unbeatable prices,”* explains Rossi. *“We do this by combining products from different parts suppliers into a single drive. We then add our own controls to the drives. The main advantage for customers is that they get the same quality as they do with the big brands, but they don’t have to pay for the name.”* ■
